John Joseph was appointed to The University of Adelaide as a Senior Lecturer in Exploration Geophysics in mid 2002. Prior to joining the university John had obtained First Class BSc and MSc degrees from India and a DSc from University of Tokyo, Japan. He was a NEDO Researcher at the Geological Survey of Japan, a Post Doctoral Fellow at Tokai University and a JSPS Fellow at Institute of Geosciences, AIST, Tsukuba, also in Japan. John has made a valuable contribution to LEME projects including a number of regional projects - most particularly the Tanami and CurnaMinex Projects. He has distinguished himself by persisting with EM surveys in the face of apparently impenetrable bush, heat, dust, flies and the occasional flood. He has supervised a number of CRC LEME Honours students and co-supervised a number of PhD students. One of his legacies in the Discipline of Geology and Geophysics will be the Mineral and Uranium interactive map of South Australia that UA plans to use at future Open Days.
